SPECIAL NOTE

Suggestions to condition flowers for exhibit: Cut in the morning and place in tepid water, or cut flowers the night before and put in warm water, and leave them in a cool place. Do not strip leaves off the stem. Cut stems longer than required so you have enough to trim during the entry process. Do not have leaves below water line in the container.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Please read important information in the front section of this book.

• **ENTRIES AND RIBBIONS WILL BE RELEASED ONLY WITH MATCHING CLAIM CHECKS.**

• **Flower and Garden is for amateur gardeners only. Amateur: Any person who is involved in gardening or floriculture for pleasure only. This person does not derive income from his or her gardening or floriculture hobby or business.**

• Entry tags are received when exhibits are brought in. All specimens should be **correctly labeled with botanical name of plant with common name** (e.g., Rudbeckia - Black-eyed Susan) except in arrangement classes. (This will be a deciding factor for judges in case of a tie, as well as more points.)

PLEASE NOTE ENTRIES CLOSE AT 7 P.M. FOR BOTH SHOWS.

• **All plant material in specimen classes must be grown by the exhibitor, from seed or transplants. Container grown and hanging plants must have been established in their container for at least 3 months. They must have saucers underneath to retain moisture, and maybe double-potted. Container should be clean and dirt free for judging.**

• Artificial flowers and silk flowers are not permitted. Dry materials may be treated.

• **Exhibitor must provide his or her own clear glass container. NO BOTTLES WILL BE PROVIDED.**

• Exhibits displayed in any type container other than clear will be disqualified. Plants and containers weighing a total of more than 40 pounds can be disqualified, if staging becomes too difficult.

• Unsightly exhibits will be removed and discarded throughout the show at the discretion of the Superintendent.

• Most specimens have a 30" height limit unless otherwise stated. Measure from top of specimen to cut end.

• Any class that does not specify a color, will mean, "any color."

• Any diseased or infested specimens will be removed.

• First Show entries will be released on the entry day of Second Show.

• Wedging permitted for specimens. (Floral foam or wood) ENTRANTS MUST PROVIDE their own WEDGING MATERIAL.

• **A spray consists of at least 1 open flower with 1 or more buds.**

• **No endangered species or invasive plants allowed.**

• An Exhibit showed in 1st show may not be entered in 2nd show.

• Regarding the Integrity of Flower and Garden, no flowers shall be purchased and entered in Horticulture, only design. We request that children that enter the Youth Flower Show be present while the entry is made. Please respect all entrants' belongings.

For all exhibits, whether cut specimens or container grown: Cultural Perfection (with correct Botanical name and common name of specimen) = 65, Condition & Grooming = 25, Distinction = 10, TOTAL = 100

- Designs may be moved by Superintendent or selected clerks, if necessary.
- Read each description carefully as they change in each section.
